This month we will witness the coronation of King Charles III. Although I was alive for the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953, I was both too young and living in Malta, so have no recollection of the day. This historical event will be an entirely new experience for the majority of this country. There is a lot of symbolism in this event with the regalia, orb, sceptre and much else have some form of significance., often dating back a thousand years. However, there is an important moment which began in Biblical times. In 1 Samuel Chapter 8, the people clamour and petition God and his prophet Samuel to anoint a King. Samuel was very reluctant to carry out this request, as he feared that this power would corrupt a person. Consequently, he tried to convince the people that this was unwise. We learn in Chapter 10 that he eventually acceded to their request and God commanded that he anoint Saul. This he did with a vial of oil poured over Saul's head. This was to signify that the King was appointed to be God's representative in their Kingdom. In other words, as King Charles has himself stated, he is to be the "Keeper of the Faith". This is a difficult and awesome responsibility. Indeed, as the book of Samuel recounts, Saul failed, and David was anointed before he even died.

Even though King Charles' power is less than his predecessors, he still has immense influence and authority. His mother Queen Elizabeth II took her responsibilities seriously; especially in respect to those concerning her faith in God. Therefore, we offer King Charles III our prayers and ask that God's grace and peace rest upon him; we trust that he will put his faith in God and let that wisdom guide him.


