For 80 years, Christian Aid has been fighting poverty and injustice. With generous support of churches they have been able to offer support to communities in crisis.

Tragically, so much that's been achieved is under threat. Climate change is destroying lives, lands and livelihoods of many communities. Extreme weather is ravaging farms and killing precious crops. Half of all children are chronically malnourished, leading to stunting that permanently affects both physical and mental development. These communities have done the least to cause climate change, yet they suffer the most. As farms are devastated, the search for solutions becomes critical. The crops on which they depend, whither and die before their eyes. With the help from Christian Aid they are hopeful to combat extreme weather by planting resilient crops, conserving water and making fertilisers.

During Christian Aid week, please help fund vital training and tools so these communities can escape hunger.

I invite you to use the following daily devotionals, during Christian Aid week.

**Sunday** - 'Serve one another with whatever gift each of you have received.' (1 Peter 4: 10)

Consider the gifts you've received. Pray over these with thanksgiving.

Loving God, Help us to serve one another, sharing gifts and talents. Fill us with generosity and compassion. Amen

**Monday** - 'Let justice roll down like water and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.' (Amos 5:4)

Today give thanks to God for life-sustaining water and make a commitment to act for justice. Lord, you love justice and righteousness. As we quench our thirst for you in prayer, refresh our commitment to doing your will. In Jesus' name. Amen

**Tuesday** - 'The earth dries up and withers... The earth lies polluted under its inhabitants for they have transgressed laws, violated the statutes, broken the everlasting covenant.' (Isaiah 24:4-5) Call upon the government to repair the damage caused by climate change? Gracious God, the earth lies polluted. We have failed to care for your world. Forgive us. Give us strength to raise our voices and challenge the powerful. May we work together for the healing of creation. Amen

**Wednesday** - 'The land will yield its fruit, and you will eat your fill and live on it securly.' (Leviticus 25:19)

Next time you're shopping or preparing a meal, take time to pray. Think of those who are worried about where their food will come from in future. Pray that we will see a time, when the voices of the marginalised will be heard and those who are hungry will eat their fill.

Holy Lord, feed our determination, and nourish our spirit. Sustain us as we put our faith into action.

**Thursday** - '...Let us consider how to provoke one another to love and do good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encourage one another...' (Hebrews 10:24-25)

Can you recall a time when you put your whole heart into something and use your passion to inspire others?

Jesus, give us tender hearts, make us encouragers. Fill us with compassion for our global neighbours. May we be inspired by passionate changemakers. Spur us on to do your work of love. Amen







You can't start a new chapter if you're still reading the same one. So let go of your past, because there is a better and brighter chapter waiting for you.


Never forget that walking away from something un healthy is brave, even if you stumble a little on your way out the door.
